

Cost Of LASIK Eye Surgery

Many doctors include pre-operative and post-operative care, as well as warranties ranging from one-year to lifetime. Be sure to compare all of these factors when you're shopping for the best price.

The average cost of LASIK eye surgery in the United States is \$2,000 per eye. Some centers will offer a better price, however it's important to remember that you should not choose your LASIK surgeon solely on the basis of cost. The skill or your ophthalmologist should be your primary concern. A less skilled ophthalmologist may charge a lower cost for the LASIK eye surgery, but he or she may not have the same degree of training, years of experience or specialized equipment as a surgeon demanding a higher price. It's recommended that patients avoid discount laser eye surgery centers that rely heavily on aggressive marketing campaigns. On the other side of the coin, paying more for the cost of LASIK does not necessarily mean that you'll get the best surgeon. Take the time to fully research the credentials of all the eye surgeons in your area.
